

STEP 1

Use the login information provided in the reviewer instruction email.



STEP 2

Once logged in, select **“Process List”** (left or right sides of screen).

STEP 3

A table will be displayed listing the submissions you are assigned to review.

Sort the submissions by “Title,” “Score” or “Review Status” by clicking on each of the headings.

Use the filter list at the top to see all reviews or those not completed.

<p>Background: Dementia is an emerging problem for First Nations peoples in Canada. Age-standardized prevalence is rising faster for First Nations than non-First Nations. Recent demographics indicate that Alzheimer's type dementia disproportionately affects younger age groups and males in First Nations populations. Moreover, Canadian First Nations, particularly the Cree Nation of Eeyou Istchee, are also at an enhanced risk for Type 2 diabetes (T2D), a risk factor for early AD onset. Culturally acceptable treatments are limited and many in the Eeyou Istchee community are looking to traditional medicinal practices to manage their diabetic symptoms. Here, we asked whether an extract of <i>Sarracenia purpurea</i> L., a plant used by the Cree of Eeyou Istchee in the treatment of diabetes, that we have previously shown protects against glucotoxicity <i>in vitro</i>, would alter behavioural impairment in the Morris Water Maze and/or central dyslipidemia in the TgCRND8 mouse model of AD.</p>
